Workforce Development Grant

In May of 2018 the Celebrate Freedom Foundation (CFF) was awarded a grant from the Central Midlands Council of Government. CFF being awarded this grant was a major accomplishment for the Foundation. We are providing a very unique way in assisting these young men and women to achieve their goals for a better future. This is a method that has not been tried before by the Central Midlands Council of Government as is known as the Midlands Workforce Development.

This grant allowed CFF to bring in interns ranging from age 18-21. We were able to hire 11 interns. All interns graduated from Richland 1 school district and 10 of them graduated in June, 2018. All of the interns came to us with various skills, to include skills in IT, Diesel Mechanics, Bio Medical, and Audio Visual. The overall goal is to achieve 1 of 5 objectives by the end of the program. The 5 goals are: 1) Attend a 4-year college; 2) Attend a local 2-year college or technical school; 3) Apprenticeship or internship in their chosen career; 4) Gainful employment; 5) Military enlistment.

On June 18th, the interns began their journey with CFF. With that, we have accomplished many things here at CFF, along with providing many of the interns with skills that they are able to place on their resume. They have all worked on the Cobra Project from Patriots Point, they have all worked on our new logistics/inventory system, W.A.S.P. and they have all attended various life skills classes that have been held at headquarter. Every Friday, CFF has had guest speakers come in and speak with them about their position, their business, themselves, their background and how they got to where they are now. Our visitors also included recruiters from all 5 US Military branches.

Currently, we have 5 of our interns attending college, 1 at Upstate USC, 1 with Coastal Carolina (online), and 3 at Midlands Technical College. We have 4 of our interns speaking with military recruiters and 1 looking for an apprenticeship for diesel mechanics and 1 still deciding his career path. All interns now have current re-

sumes, have learned to construct cover letters and thank you letters for after an interview.

Celebrate Freedom Foundation's goal is for %100 success with all of the interns!

We finished the refurbishment of the Marine Cobra for Patriots Point and it was delivered the last week of August. This has been a team effort to include the contributions of our interns and caps off a very productive and fast moving summer for our foundation.

Patriot Point Helicopter Restoration

Celebrate Freedom Foundation was asked in April of this year by Patriots Point Museum, located in Charleston, SC., tp perform the cosmetic restoration of their Marine Corps AH-1 Seacobra. It had been placed at the museum in 1996 and had not moved since. With limited funds and taking beatings from hail storms and hurricanes it was in rough shape. CFF used our own equipment to bring the Seacobra to our HQs hanger in West Columbia, SC. We took the blades and hub off of it and began work on them. They were not to be used again for flight so we were able to patch and paint them for reinstall. The body of the helicopter consisted of a lot of sanding and filling with resin before it was painted with the paint supplied by PPG Aerospace . The last thing to be done before it was complete and ready for delivery was the application of all the stencils, these were applied to the helicopter according the Marine Corps standards. On August 30th CFF delivered the Seacobra back to Patriots Point and placed in its original spot, completing the mission.

Every CFF volunteer and intern involved can be proud of the work completed and this accomplishment. Thanks to Patriots Point Museum and PPG Aerospace for your help.
